Introduction and purpose of the survey / audit

We live in a community that is rich and diverse in terms of its environment, its liveability and the government, community and commercial services on offer. The skills, interests and work experiences of its residents are equally rich and diverse. We really have a lot that we can offer one another.

Southside Community Services Inc (SCS) is conducting this survey to get a better picture of our community's strengths and to work out what we can do to support and enable local residents to engage more strongly in their local community for the benefit of us all. The survey will give us a clearer picture of the skills, knowledge and experience that local people have, and which they may be willing to share with others in the community. It will also tell us what local people like about the community, and what they would most like to change.

- The winners will be notified no later than 30 April 2015 and an announcement will be placed on the SCS website stating that the draw has taken place and that the winners have accepted their prize/s. No identifying details of the prize winners will be made public.
